## Message from T/Inspector Sarah Jope

With the lighter nights and the warmer weather upon us I encourage residents to be vigilant with the security of their homes and boats. The warm weather prompts an influx of visitors to the area, whom we all welcome, but this can also create an opportunity for thieves. Think about your home security and don't leave doors and windows open or unlocked. Report any suspicious vehicles or people to us if you see them, don't presume someone else will call us. Look out for your neighbours too as a close knit community promotes crime prevention and makes places less attractive to a thief.

## Crime Updates (1st - 30th June)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Residential	0	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Business and Community	0	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	0	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.



## Message from your Engagement Officer

North Norfolk Police and Norfolk Trading Standards are warning residents to be on their guard against cold callers. Individuals are cold calling by phone or on the doorstep across North Norfolk attempting to sell artwork, various domestic items or offering to do unnecessary work at an excessive price. Police have been taking positive action and if callers are found not to be in possession of a Pedlar's Certificate those responsible are interviewed, reported to court and all their items seized. Police are advising the public to call the police on 101 should a cold caller visit them and make any elderly or vulnerable relatives and neighbours aware.
