News from the Parish Council

We thank them both for all that they have done for the community over the years that they served on the Parish Council. We welcome Steven Hall as a new councillor. There are, however, two vacancies on the Parish Council. Please do contact a councillor or the Clerk to find out more. We look forward to hearing from you.

Fly Survey: It was noted at the meeting that flies are beginning to be appear again. In order to help map the extant of the problem, the Parish Council has decided to do another fly survey. Please do take the time to complete the survey which is enclosed with the newsletter and return it by 25 June to the collection post box in the Flower Hut outside 24 Thursford Road (or post it to the Parish Clerk). Kissing Gate: The County Council has given Notice of their Decision to make an Order under section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to modify the Definitive Map and Statement by adding a gate at the east end of Footpath No 1. If no objections are received the Council will confirm the Order. The Order will then be submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation.

Residents and others have previously said that they would be willing to fundraise for a replacement kissing

gate. If sufficient funds are raised to cover the cost of supply, installation and on-going maintenance for a new kissing gate, the Parish Council would be willing to take responsibility for the gate so that it would be covered by the Council's Public Liability insurance,.

The **Book Exchange** has been made watertight once again and has now reopened and is looking very smart. Come and have a look at the new stock of books.

Thank you to all those who helped while the problems with leaks were sorted out. Vanessa Thompson made extensive searches online and talked to a number of people who have similar kiosks;

Remember to pick up after you dog

Help keep the village clean and safe. There are two green dog bins provided by the Parish Council one near the Social Club and the other on Dildash Lane near the track to the allotments. Please use these bins or take the poo home and put in your own bin for general household rubbish.

Do note that it is an offence not to clean up after your dog in any public area (including roads, verges and private land open to the public) in North Norfolk.

Failure to do so will incur an £80 fixed penalty fine (max £1,000).
